OUR STORY

In 2001 a group of Hunter Valley horsemen journeyed to Corryong, Victoria to compete in the Man From Snowy River Stockman's Challenge. A few repeat visits south got them hooked on the concept and so, with the help of some enthusiastic volunteers, they formed the King of the Ranges Stockman's Challenge Committee.

They set out with the mission of preserving and bringing public attention to the traditional skills of Australian stockmanship and bushcraft and held their inaugural event in 2004 at the Rosedale Horse Complex, Murrurundi.

Today the King of the Ranges is in it's 19th year and is still a not-for-profit community group, run by local volunteers.

HISTORY



Inspiration for the event may have started in Corryong but evolved thanks to stories of Archie 'Bung' McInnes, a local stockman and brave Light Horseman from the early 1900's. He was known through the Hunter Valley as 'The King of the Ranges' for his hazardous work in difficult terrain and his widespread success in the rodeo ring. Not only was he a great buckjump rider and bushman, but he had few equals as a stockman.

Bung joined the First Battalion Light Horse at the outbreak of World War 1 and was wounded during the

Beersheba Desert Campaign. He was later decorated with the Military Medal and, after the war, continued his life as a stockman and champion buckjump rider. Bung died at Glenrock Station in 1940 exactly as he had wished; "with my boots on and in the saddle."

OUR TOWN



Murrurundi is a picturesque town, which sits at the foot of the Liverpool Range and at the head of the Pages River. It is surrounded by mountains and fertile farming land and is known as the 'Crown of the Hunter'.

THE STOCKMAN'S

The King of the Ranges Stockmen's Challenge showcases the traditional skills of Australian stockmen and women over an exciting and intense 3 day challenge. Cumulative points are gathered over six preliminary events; stock handling, packsaddle, bareback, shoeing, whipcrack and cross country.



Preliminary events take place on Friday and Saturday with the finals on Sunday. Divisions are; **Striplings** (8-13), **Juniors** (14 - 18), **Novice** (never finaled in a Stockman's Challenge before), **Ladies** and **Open**.

STOCK HANDLING

Using horse and dog, work a group of cattle free from the mob and navigate a course.

Within a set time, competitors must draft out cattle and complete a cutout then, in a controlled manner using a working dog, move three head through an obstacle course.

PACKSADDLE

Pack a packsaddle and lead a pack horse through the bush.

Competitors get 6 minutes to pack saddle and bags on their competition horse, ensuring it's balanced. Pack horse is then led through an obstacle course to campsite where horse is unpacked.

BAREBACK

Riders must be ready to face any obstacle no matter what gear is available.

Riding bareback competitors navigate a course designed to demonstrate skill, control and

manoeuvrability of their horse. The 60 second freestyle routine further demonstrates the horse's ability.



CHALLENGE

SHOEING

Shoe a horse so it can be ridden over rugged terrain.

Depending on category, competitors trim a front and hind hoof, shape shoes and apply them in a set time.

WHIPCRACK

Crack a stock whip to control stock while riding at speed.

Cleanly cut targets with a stock whip on a set course and within the time limit. A 30 second freestyle further demonstrates skill with a whip.

CROSS COUNTRY OBSTACLES

Gallop over logs, down banks and through gullies while mustering.

Riding in a stock saddle, competitors must complete a 2km course with 20 obstacles as close to optimum time as possible.

THE WORKING HORSE CHALLENGE

The Working Horse Challenge runs separately to the Stockman's Challenge and is the same format as a working cow horse challenge. There are two events on Saturday, a dry work phase (ride a set pattern) and a wet work phase (cattle work). Both phases are designed to highlight the ability and versatility of the horse and its relationship to the rider.

The top five riders after the two preliminary events will go into the final on Sunday, which is working horse pattern.





INDIGENOUS STOCKMAN'S PROGRAM

Inspired by our history, the voices and images of Indigenous stockmen, camp cooks, drovers, fencers, shearers... Our Indigenous Ringers are a part of Australia's soul. They share a unique oneness with our land and animals.

With the aim of honouring and continuing their legacy, King of the Ranges created this program in 2015 to assist young Aboriginal stockmen and women from Northern Australia to develop skills and experiences to benefit their careers.



Successful recipients travel to the Upper Hunter, stay locally, and spend time under the guidance of experienced King of the Ranges members. They expand skills, compete in the Challenge and participate in a range of activities aimed at increasing confidence and furthering their all round development.



Min age 5yrs. Max weight 50kg.


